Barriers to f	uture attainment for PP eligible pupils
In-school bar	rriers (issues to be addressed in school, such as poor oral language skills)
1.	In KS1, the outcomes for pupil premium pupils is slightly lower for maths than it is nationally and compared to non-pupil premium pupils.
2.	In KS2, the outcomes for pupil premium pupils is lower than national for reading and writing and compared to monpupil premium pupils.
3.	Internal performance data for current Y2, Y3, Y4 and Y5 shows that pupils eligible for pupil premium attain slightly lower than those who do not for reading, writing and maths.
4.	Some pupils identified as pupil premium also have additional vulnerabilities such as SEND needs.
External barr	iers
5.	There is still a very small gap in the number of pupils eligible for pupil premium who display persistent absence and a slightly smaller amount of pupil premium pupils miss on average more sessions of school than non-pupil premium pupils.
6.	Social and emotional barriers for vulnerable pupils are negatively impacting progress and attainment for some pupil premium pupils
